NJ politicians, officials tweet reactions to 2nd presidential debate

Twitter users tweeted their reactions to the second presidential debate, filling the twittersphere with political opinions as Obama and Romney squared off Tuesday at Hofstra University in Hempstead, N.Y.

Everybody from state politicians to local blogs weighed in with their thoughts on the various domestic and foreign-policy issues covered in the debate.

"Romney missed the pivot on Libya," tweeted Patrick Murray, of Monmouth University's Polling Institute on the killing of four Americans in Libya, including the U.S.'s ambassador there. "He needed to restate the question. Who refused the request for extra security? List that exchange."

Cory Booker, Democratic Mayor of Newark, added his input when it came to the candidates' healthcare policies.

"How can Romney say ObamaCare is a deterrent for job creation when he did the same thing in Massachusetts?" Booker tweeted. "Why was it good (for Massachusetts), but not U.S.A."

Besides policies, other tweets discussed the debate process and moderator, and the behavior of the candidates.

"Candy Crowley just corrected Mitt Romney on a fact. Yes she did," tweeted Blue Jersey, when moderator Crowley said Obama did call the attack on the Libyan ambassador an act of terror from the day after it happened, contrary to what Romney claimed.

"Obama had three additional minutes of talk time over Romney," tweeted Save Jersey, the official twitter feed of New Jersey's top conservative blog. "And yet (Obama) still complains. Where's Mitt's fair share?"
