Methodology

The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Anderson Robbins Research (D) and Shaw & Company Research (R). The poll is based on live telephone interviews with a national sample of 912 registered voters, and was conducted March 10-12, 2012.

Landline and cell phone telephone numbers were randomly selected for inclusion in the survey using a probability proportionate to size method, which means that phone numbers for each state are proportional to the number of voters in each state.

Results based on the full sample have a margin of sampling error of $\pm 3\%$

Results among subgroups have larger sampling errors, including:

Democrats (n = 367) $\pm 5\%$

Republicans (n = 337) $\pm 5\%$

Independents (n = 190) $\pm 7\%$

GOP Primary Voters (n = 341) $\pm 5\%$

LV = likely voters
